

Babaji's Kriya Yoga Ashram in Badrinath has been designed by two renowned vastu architects, and offers the following facilities:

- 13 Comfortable Apartments. Each apartment has about 290 square feet (27 square meters) and two beds, a kitchen, bathroom with sink, shower and toilet, hot water, space heaters, desk, kitchen tables and chairs. Clean sheets, blankets, towels and pillows are provided.
- A Meditation hall, with 110 square meters (1,184 square feet) with hardwood floor, space heaters
- A Yoga Hall, with 120 square meters, (1,292 square feet) with tile floor, space heaters.
- A communal dining room and kitchen
- Bookstore
- Office
- Communal toilets and shower for day visitors
- Community garden with local vegetables and flowers.
- Mantra Yagna Peetam
- A supportive manager and staff

There is no other place where devotees of Kriya Babaji can come closer to Him, spiritually, than Badrinath. His grace and presence are felt there palpably by all. The air in Badrinath is spiritually charged; with little effort the mind is quieted. Badrinath continues to have a magnetic pull on everyone who is drawn to Babaji.

Badrinath is in the upper Himalayan mountains of India, 25 kilometers from the border of Tibet. The ashram is in an area where only ashrams, but no vehicles are allowed, one kilometer from the nearest road. It is on a gentle slope, facing east, just below the steep path that rises to the base of Mt. Neelakantan. It has a magnificent panoramic view of the valley of Badrinath. An amazing waterfall is just to the south, about a quarter mile away. At an altitude of 10,300 feet (3,140 meters), it is surrounded by snow capped mountains rising to 23,000 feet (7,010 meters). It is a 15-minute walk to the famous temple of Sri Badrinarayan, the destination of tens of thousands of pilgrims every year.

Badrinath is closed for the winter due to snowfall from early November to early May.

Visitors who require accommodations must make prior reservations and pay a suggested contribution.
